

Reporting Results of the Climate Finance Readiness Program



Once a year, the Climate Finance Readiness Program, which was implemented by German Development Cooperation (GIZ), would carry out program monitoring. EBP applied its climate expertise to help GIZ evaluate and report program results.

Improving Access to Climate Finance

The GIZ implemented on behalf of the German federal government the multi-year Climate Finance Readiness Program. The program was designed to help select countries improve their capacities and institutional frameworks for accessing international climate finance, particularly from the Green Climate Fund (GCF).

Results Monitoring with a Climate Lens

EBP applied its climate lens to support the GIZ with the evaluation and reporting of results of the Climate Finance Readiness Program. GIZ used the reports to keep its clients informed about program progress, to measure its successes, to identify next steps and areas for improvement, and to document acquired knowledge from the program. This type of reporting and documentation is vital for programs such as this one, which stretch over many years and have multiple objectives and partner countries.
